1. What are some of the sources of migration to this area, both historically and today?

2. What are some of the practical, day-to-day issues associated that come with being undocumented? What would it look like to organize around these issues, and what would challenges and risks would be involved?

3. What would it look like to be able to effectively defend members of targetted communities from ICE? What sorts of formal & informal infrastructure would this require?

4. Where are migrants detained in this area? What form could organizing against migrant detention take? What barriers exist, and what are some practical ways of addressing them?

5. What are some of the corporations that profit from immigration enforcement and/or temporary foreign worker laws in the area? What would it look like to put pressure on them, and how could this be beneficial if done in the service of other organizing campaigns?
